Part 1

Co-work: Pandemic and Post-Pandemic

Co-work is a project name short for "Japan-China-Korea Students' Co-work of Animation" which began in 2010. Students from the three countries form mixed teams to complete short animated projects. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the project was kept alive through online efforts, but resumed in-person production in 2023. Co-work alumni from during and after the global chaos will present the processes and results of their collaboration.

Co-work 2022 "Emotions in Isolation"

The theme of Co-work 2022 was "Emotions in Isolation." The COVID-19 pandemic dogmatically divided the world and secluded people in ways never imagined in the modern era. But in truth, isolation always existed close to us or even within us-in war, in social media, at home, in our minds. 

Forming and Presenting Game Ideas

One field that is closely linked with animation and other cinematic expressions is games. As a related event of AAEN 2024 in Bangkok, a workshop on game planning was held by Takashi Tokita who is a renowned producer at SQUARE ENIX CO., LTD. and also a Visiting Professor at Tokyo University of the Arts.

In the workshop, teams of participants were tasked with ideating a game based on a common theme. The students experienced the process of producing a game plan as a group within a limited time frame and learned what significance this holds in the development of games. The importance of revealing their ideas in an engaging presentation was also shared.
